Strathmore Drawing Pad, 18" x 24" or similar. (70-80lb. paper)

..or loose sheets of drawing paper

Drawing board, masonite or Foamcore large enough to support your larger size drawing paperor a table surface to work on.

Bulldog clips or painter's tape to secure paper to your drawing board

Sketchbook, preferably spiral-bound, 9x12ish, 10x10 or so

Please feel free to use drawing materials that you have on hand. You should at least have pencils, erasers, charcoal, India ink or black acrylic and white acrylic paint or gesso and brushes for those.

Colored paper: black, gray, etc. or acrylic paint to color plain drawing paper.

Here are some suggestions, if you wish to purchase new:

Charcoal sticks or vine charcoal

Conte Crayons

Graphite sticks 3B-6B, or harder ones (H) if you prefer delicate greys. I like the woodless type which don't need constant sharpening

Colored pencils or oil pastels

Watercolors or gouache and watercolor palette

Sharpie-type permanent marker pens

Erasers

India ink or black acrylic paint

White acrylic paint or gesso

Bristle paint brushes, the bigger the better

Watercolor brushes, the bigger the better, size 12 or so

Plastic or glass water container

Paper towels

Glue sticks, scissors, ruler

Scissors
